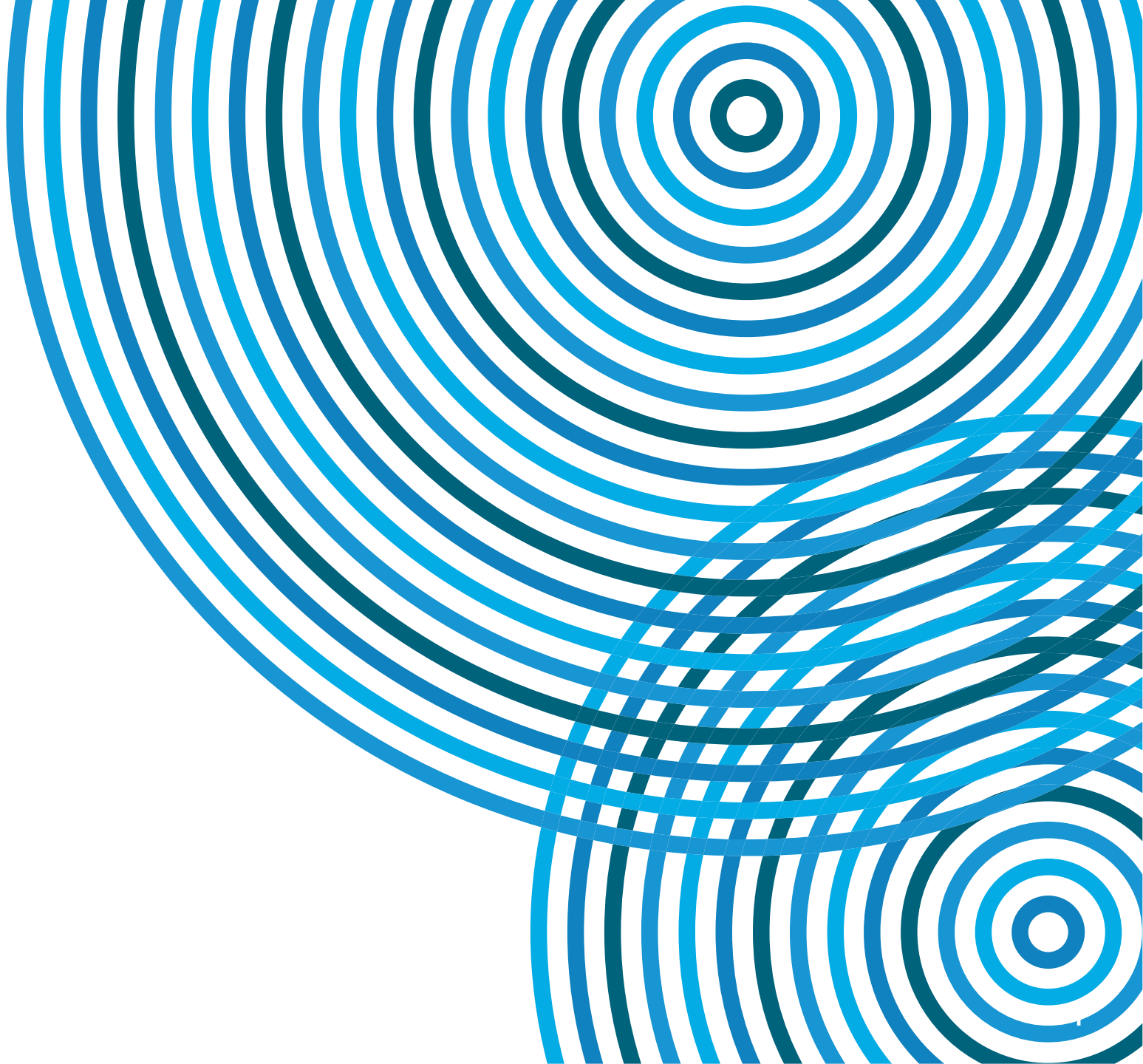

UKE plans to hold a 5G auction and issue spectrum reservation decisions in 2022

The action plan of the Office of Electronic Communications (UKE) for 2022 provides for carrying a selection procedure and issuing of spectrum reservation decisions for the 3.6 GHz frequency band which is dedicated to the 5G technology.

UKE's remaining goals for next year include activities aimed at increasing the access to telecommunication services. UKE assumes that by the end of 2022 70% of households will be within the reach of Internet access connections offering data speeds of at least 100 Mbps, with a possibility of upgrading the data speeds to gigabit levels.

The office also intends to support the roll-out of broadband networks and make infrastructure sharing easier by, among others, issuing 160 decisions regarding terms of access to real estate.

Polsat Box informs of “extension of the scope of cooperation” with Canal+

Polsat Box digital platform (formerly Cyfrowy Polsat) has added seven channels from the Canal+ portfolio as well as another ViacomCBS channel to its offer.

The new Canal+ channels include such movie and TV-series channels as Ale kino+ and Novelas+, a documentary Planete+ channel, a cooking channel Canal+ Kuchnia, a lifestyle Canal+ Domo HD channel as well as two children’s channels: MiniMini+ and teleToon+. The new item from ViacomCBS is TeenNick – a channel which offers movies and TV series that are popular among youngsters aged 10-16.

As part of the Christmas “open window” all these channel will be available at no additional charge during the first month.

Next year is to see the launch of several streaming platforms in Poland, including HBO Max, Disney+ and SkyShowtime. Pay TV operators are working on alternative offers in advance.

Netflix will pay for causing congestion of telecom networks in Europe? This is what network operators want

According to Reuters, European telecom operators, including Deutsche Telekom, Vodafone, BT Group, Telekom Austria, KPN and Swisscom issued a joint statement in which they postulate that part of the cost that they have to incur in connection with investing into the 5G network, the fiber-optic or cable networks be paid by global technology corporations.

As the operators pointed out in their statement, big and growing share of network traffic is generated and monetized by the big technology platforms while requiring continuous investments and planning by the telecommunication industry.
